Background

Since 2013, Cedefop has been working on constructing a **skills index**. Three key dimensions have been considered; namely: a) **skills development**, b) **skills activation**, and c) **skills matching**. These, altogether, capture different aspects of a country's skills system. In particular, **skills development** represents the training and education activities that take place in a country, and their immediate outputs in terms of skills developed and attained, **skills activation** assesses the transition from education to the labour market, while **skills matching** captures the extent that skills are effectively used at work and the labour market in general. Altogether the **European Skills Index** measures the comparative performance of the skills system of each EU country.

Event's aim

The aim of the event is to introduce the **European Skills Index**, as well as present and discuss the results of the 2018 release. Country rankings will be presented along with examples of how such a tool can be useful for interrogating a country's skills system and identifying areas allowing room for improvement. In parallel, the relations of a skills system to key employment measures that are policy relevant will be discussed. A panel debate will discuss the implications of the results for skills and labour market policies as well as how such an index can be used as a policy tool.
