It has been a town since 1928. The population in 2020 was 23,273. The name of the town comes from the Ogre river. The Ogre village was first mentioned in 1206, called "Ogre" in German. In 1861, when a railway Riga–Daugavpils was built, Riga's residents started to build summer cottages here. In 1862 Ogre became a health resort.
